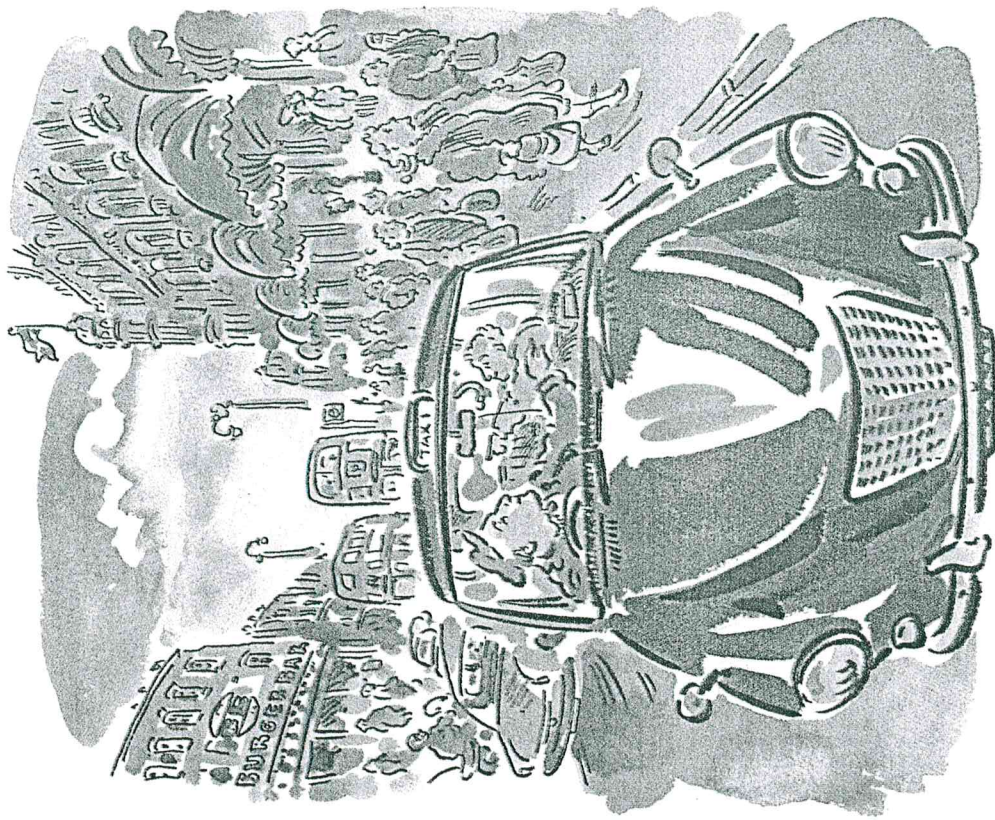




"Now, are you hungry?" asks Tommy.

An hour later Dino comes out of the restaurant.

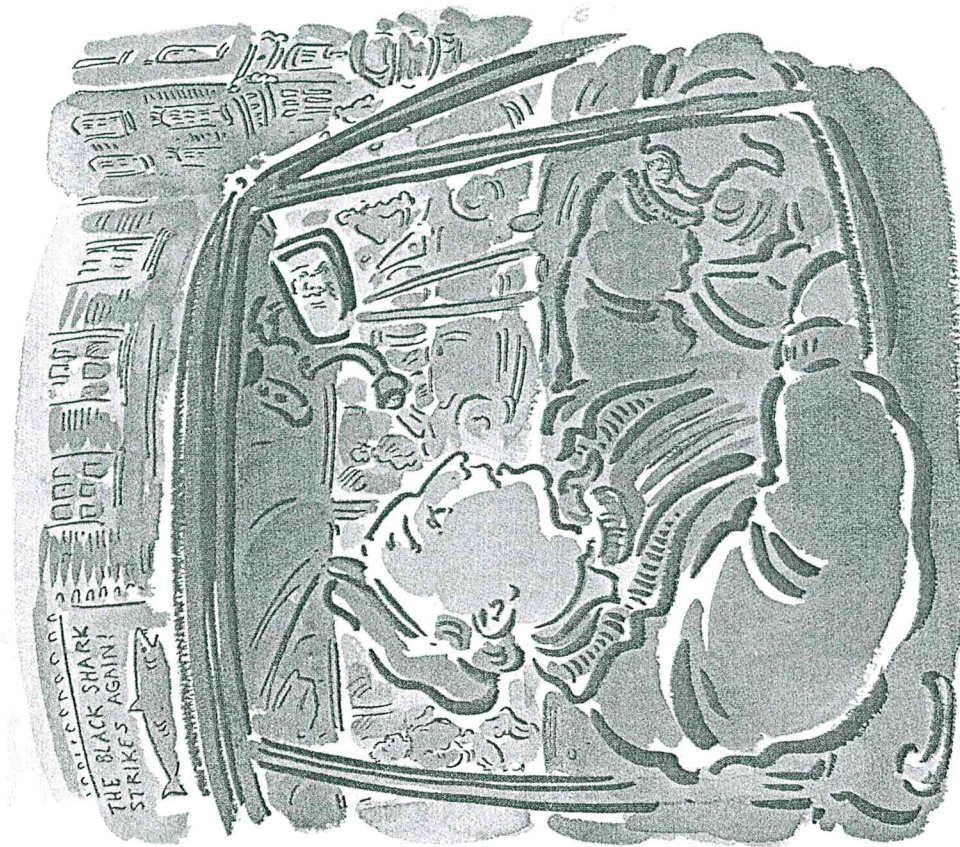


"Be *very nice* to the boy," thinks Tommy. "Do you want to go to the British Museum now?" he asks.

"Good," thinks Tommy.

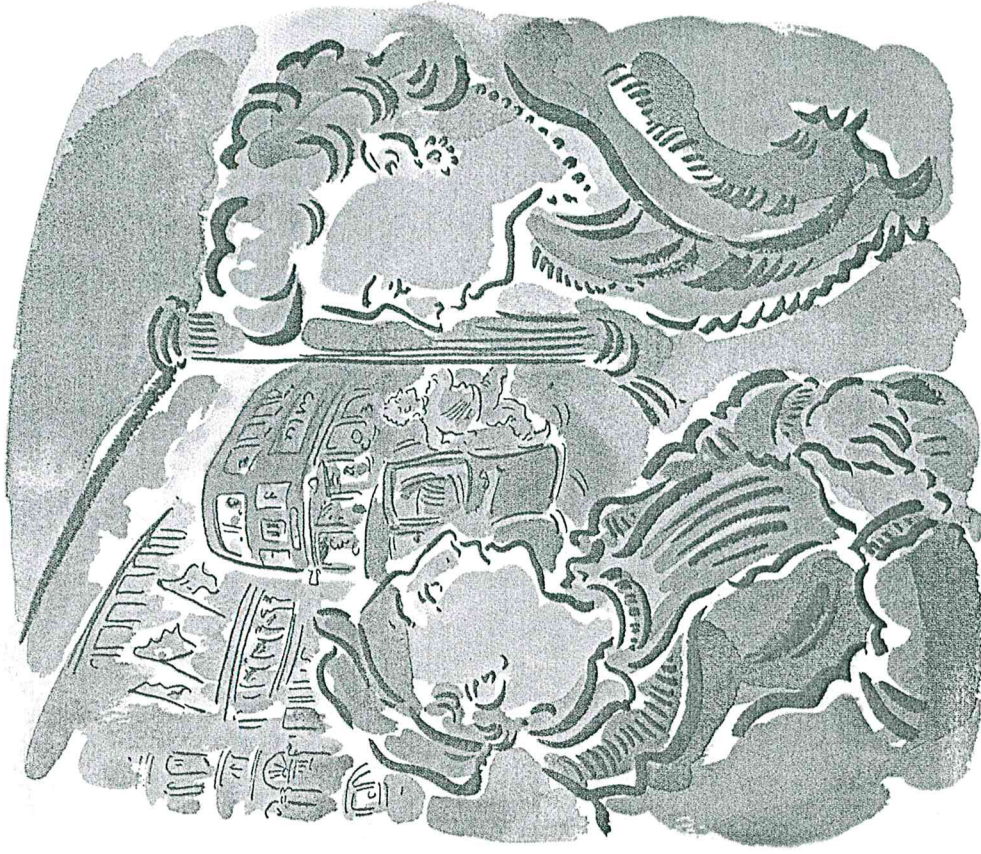
Tommy starts the car again.

"I know that woman," thinks Tommy. Then he remembers. "Of course, it's Gloria Brash!"

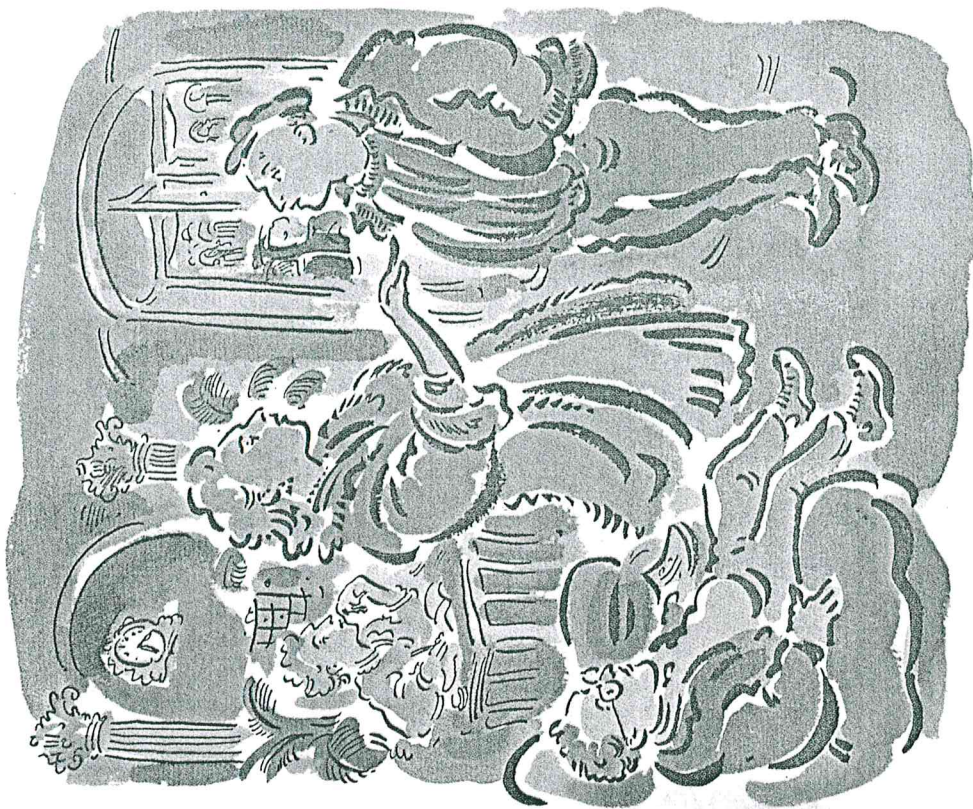

"I am *very* angry," says Gloria.

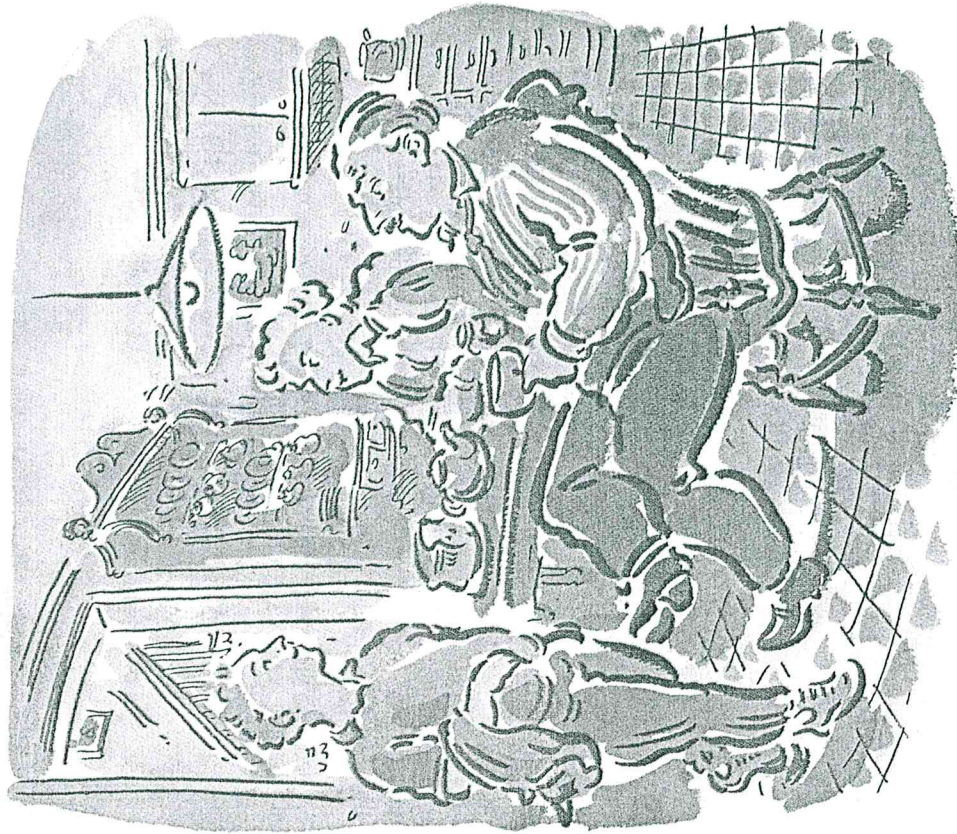


Tommy looks at the boy, at the film star, and at the young boy again.
